They Themselves Provoke a Reaction and Then They Themselves Cry About It

Who in Lithuania will put a stop to director of the Jerusalem bureau of the Simon Wiesenthal Center Efraim Zuroff? Why does Lithuania remain silent while he eternally interferes in the internal affairs of our country?

Recently, as he visited Lithuania, E. Zuroff and his fellow traveler Dovid Katz yet again at a press conference taught Lithuanians who should take part in February 16th [Lithuanian Independence Day] celebrations and what slogans they should carry and chant. Because they were very angered Kaunas allowed so-called nationalists to march publicly during the holiday.

This was the fact, as was the fact that after the war it wasn't just one or two Jews who contributed to the exile of thousands of Lithuanians and the murder of partisans.

E. Zuroff, who tries to order people around in Lithuania as if it were his own bureau, doesn't recall these facts.
